

Freedom Fighters from North East

Freedom fighters are considered the epitome of patriotic people. They were the people who sacrificed their lives selflessly for the freedom of their country or motherland, so that people of next generation could have a free & bright future. The amount of pain & hardship, they had endured cannot be put into words & the generation after generation will always be indebted to them. They are the ones because of whom we celebrate Independence Day.

We, at Star Public School are developing a project for the students to get an exposure on the freedom fighters of North East, the legends, known for their valor, courage & sacrifice. With the motive to enhance their knowledge about them a quiz will be organized for the students in the month of September based on the lives of these freedom fighters.

Here, it is indispensable to mention the names of a few freedom fighters of North-Eastern part of India. They are:

(a) Tirot Sing also known as U Tirot Sing Syiem, was the chief of the Khasi tribe in Meghalaya, born in 1802, who declared war against the British during the invasion of Khasi Hills.

(b) Pa Togan Nengminza was a Garo warrior, who along with other Garo warriors attacked the British soldiers, though unsuccessful owing to ill-equipped.

(c) U. Kiang Nangbah was a khasi (Pnar) freedom fighter from Meghalaya, who led an uprising against the British. He was hanged publicly at Lawmusiang in Jowai town, west Jaintia Hills.

(d) Rani Gaidinliu was a Naga spiritual & Political leader, who led a revolt against British rule in India. At the age of 13, she joined the Heraka religious, movement, later turned into a political movement. At age of 16, she was sentenced to life imprisonment.

Jawaharlal Nehru met her in Shillong jail in 1937. He gave her the title of "Rani". She was released from jail the in 1947.

(e) Bir Tikendrajit Singh: He was the commander of the Manipuri army. He holds a unique position in India's freedom struggle. He was against the imperialism & colonialism, (f) Lachit Borphukan: He was a commander in the Ahom kingdom, located in presentday Assam, India, known for his leadership in the 1671 Battle of Saraighat.

(g) Kanaklata Baruah was one of the greatest warriors of Assam who fought for the freedom of our country with the British forces and was shot dead by the Indian Imperial Police of the British Raj.

(h) Paona Brajabasi was a Manipuri military officer. He was born in 1833 and later entered the military of the Manipur Kingdom, reaching the rank of major by 1891. The same year he fought in the Anglo-Manipur War against the British Empire.

(i) Lungthoubu Thangal better known as Thangal Menjor and later known as Thangal General was a legendary hero of Thangal tribe. From his childhood he had a peculiar character and appearance and had extraordinary strength. He fought in the Anglo-Manipur War against the British Empire.

(j) Sachindra Lal Singh was a leader of the Indian National Congress and the first Chief Minister of Tripura state in North-Eastern India from 1st July 1963 to 1st November 1971. In 1977, he became the leader of the newly formed Congress for Democracy party. He was elected to the sixth Lok Sabha from Tripura West constituency as a member of the congress for Democracy.

Schools shall get priority in future endeavours of NCFE and shall be part of the social media campaign of NCFE regarding Money Smart Schools.

Nartiang is also known for the Durga Mandir which is said to be 600 years old and is counted as one of the 51 Shakti Peethas. Nartiang is also known for its one of the tallest monolithic parks in the world. The Monoliths of Nartiang are magnificent archaeological structures.


Workshop for Mathematics Teachers
